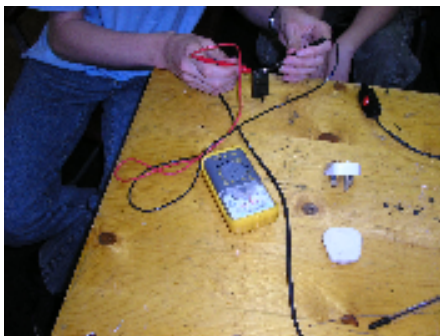
Cadets Communication Course!
